

Eclipse Corda Necklace



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Note to the maker

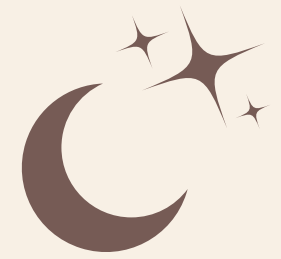
Thank you for choosing to create the **Eclipse Corda Necklace**. I hope it brings you the same sense of calm and freedom it brought me as I made it.

Whether you're a seasoned crafter or just beginning to explore the beauty of crochet, take your time and enjoy each step. Let the stitches lead you. Let the yarn decide. And if you find yourself adjusting the length, changing the yarn, or adding your own touch—know that you're doing it exactly right.

Here's to soft cotton, gentle evenings, and the magic of making something with your hands.



Eclipse Corda Necklace



A long, versatile crochet necklace combining delicate chain stitches with a distinctive Romanian cord and natural wooden beads. Finished with a playful tassel, it can be worn long and relaxed, or wrapped around the neck to create a completely different look. The sliding beads allow you to change its appearance and position, making each way of wearing it a little different.

WRAPPED AROUND
THE NECK

Material



YARN

Sport yarn, white/black, or any color of your choice

Composition: 100% cotton

Meterage: 137 yards (125 meters)

Unit weight: 50 grams (1.76 ounces)

Amount of yarn: leftovers suitable for 2 strands of yarn held together

HOOKS, NEEDLES & OTHER SUPPLIES

- 3.5 mm crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- 8 natural wood color wooden beads – 15mm / 0.6in in diameter
- 1 brown/beige wooden bead – 20mm / 0.8in in diameter
- 1 red/pink wooden bead – 10mm / 0.4in in diameter
- a piece of cardboard for making the tassel:
15 x 15cm / 6 x 6in for the white variation, or
10 x 10cm / 4 x 4in for the black version.

TENSION

18-20sc in 12 rows = 10 x 10cm/4 x 4in

Instructions

Step 1 - Holding double strand yarn, do 70ch, then continue doing the Romanian cord stitch which should be 40cm / 16in long; then do another 70ch. Leave long tails and break yarn but leave the last loop open.



In this photo, and all photos below, you can see the finished white necklace, while the black one is being made.

Step 2 - Insert one end of the 70ch into 3 natural wood color beads. Insert the other 70ch end into another 3 natural wood color beads (see picture below).



Step 3 - Join the two chains together by inserting the last loop through the first stitch, and pull once again to secure.



Step 4 - Insert both joined chains in the 20mm / 0.8in bead, then both ends in 2 beads which are 15mm / 0.6in.

For the white version the 20mm / 0.8in bead is brown, the next 2 are red and natural wood color.

For the black version the 20mm / 0.8in bead is natural wood color, the next 2 are pink and natural wood color.



Step 5 - Secure the join of the 2 chains below the last bead with 2 knots. Insert the 2-tail ends into a 10mm / 0.4in bead, and also secure the tails below the bead with a few knots. DO NOT cut the yarn tails.

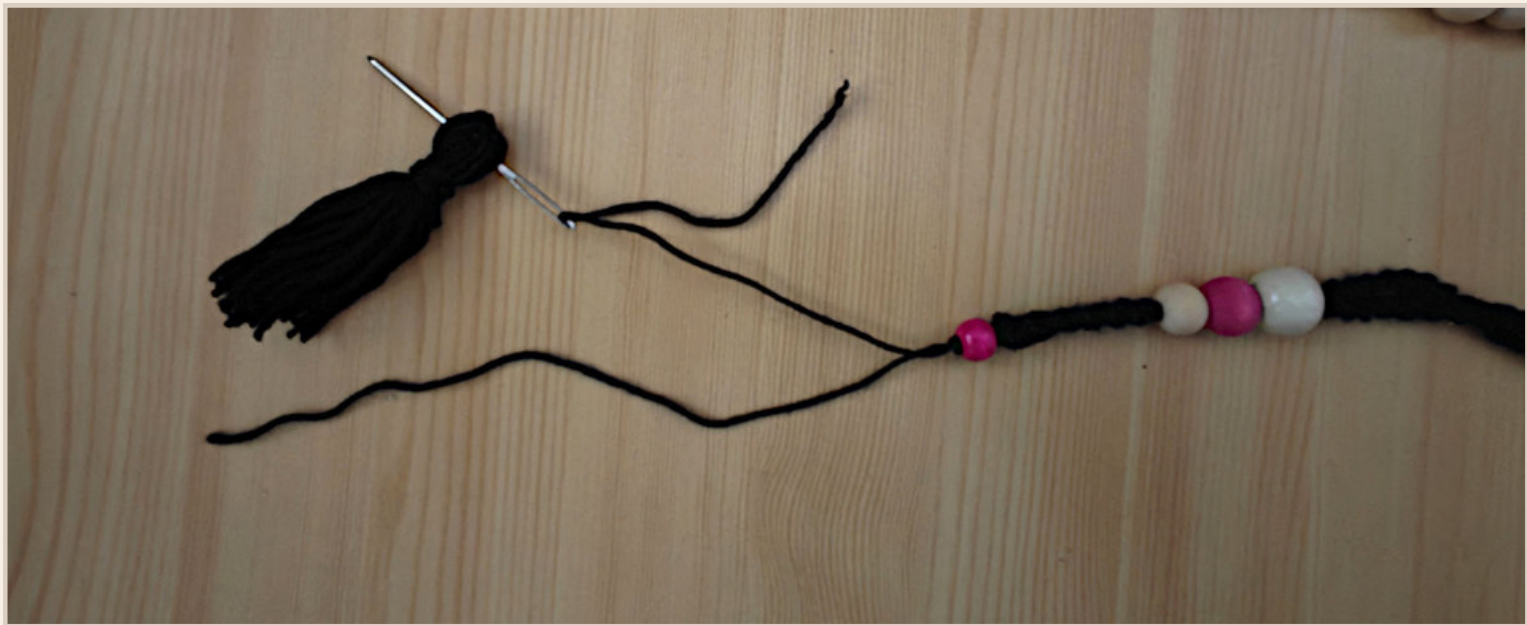


Step 6 - Make a tassel by wrapping double-strand yarn 20 times around a piece of cardboard.

Step 7 - Thread the tapestry needle with one strand of yarn tail.



Step 8 - Pull yarn through the top of the tassel. Tie it with the other end into a few tight knots.



Step 9 - Pull both ends through the tassel downwards, and trim excess yarn.



Step 10 - Trim the tassel ends as well, to get a nicely shaped tassel of the desired length.
